In Indonesia, EdHeroes partnered with the Royal Palace of Yogyakarta for the Masterpiece Batik: Humanity in Harmony project, an initiative organized alongside the Indonesian Children's Cancer Foundation.



Spanning three cities, this project used the traditional art of Batik to provide children fighting cancer with creative experiences and healing opportunities, while also raising funds to support their treatment. The event reflected the profound connection between cultural heritage, compassion, and community-driven impact.

We also celebrated a milestone moment in Singapore, where, with the support of our EdHeroes Hub, Allin Technologies, we hosted our first in-person awards ceremony. This event was a celebration of the extraordinary individuals and organizations whose dedication and innovation have advanced educational opportunities around the world.

EdHeroes is a community of 270 000+ individuals, from 124 countries worldwide. We are represented by organizations in 12 countries and work with hundreds of organizations each year. This year marked significant growth for EdHeroes as we expanded our global network. We welcomed new experts to our advisory board and launched two specialized committees, bringing together leaders from diverse fields to tackle pressing educational challenges and create actionable solutions on a global scale.


Driven by a passion for education and a commitment to making a real difference, we invite you to join us in this vital mission. Together, we can create a brighter future through education.

The demonstration of gains in oral language skills (e.g., phonological awareness, appropriate use of vocabulary, following and constructing narratives) and emergent literacy skills (e.g., concepts of print, letter recognition, identification of print letters).

Improved Academic Performance


Concept of Glocality

February

Yayasan Puteri Indonesia Debate Session

In collaboration with the Puteri Indonesia Foundation, EdHeroes hosted a Debate Competition that drew over 60,000 viewers, emphasizing the role of education in critical thinking and communication. Participants offered diverse insights and innovative solutions to societal issues.



June

Podcast Launch

The EdHeroes Voices Podcast debuted as a video series covering key topics in education, culture, and global development. Hosted by CEO Alina Baimen, it features international guest discussions. Available on Spotify, Castbox, and YouTube, it highlights educational innovations.



July

EdHeroes Global Forum

The EdHeroes Global Forum: Cultural Heritage in Education presented an impressive roster of 105 speakers from 40 countries, delivering 38 sessions over 27 hours of livestream content. The event reached over 120,000 unique viewers and generated more than 1,550 media publications, serving as a vital platform for dialogue and educational innovation.

August

Mahakarya Batik: Humanity in Harmony

EdHeroes co-hosted a humanitarian mission with local partners in Surakarta, Jakarta, and Yogyakarta. This initiative enriched children's lives with creative experiences and fundraising for their treatment. A remarkable outcome was the creation of a 50-meter Batik cloth in collaboration with Indonesian craftsmen, symbolizing cultural heritage and unity.



September

New EdHeroes Hub in China

EdHeroes launched a new Hub in China with the International Exchange Center for Confucius Studies (IECCS), led by Muyuan Liu. IECCS revolutionizes international collaboration and educational innovation through study tours, seminars, and advanced online learning, setting the stage for a new era in global education.



New EdHeroes Hub in Türkiye—InCommon

Another EdHeroes Hub was launched in Türkiye with InCommon, a community advocating for education paradigms that foster sustainability and peace. By designing creative interactions, InCommon mobilizes collective intelligence in education through Studio, Fellows, and Tools InCommon.

Edugist in Nigeria, an impactfocused newsroom and education innovation lab, was launched. This partnership facilitates change by providing vital data, education reporting, advocacy, and initiatives to ensure inclusive, quality education for all.



October

KODA is an association dedicated to improving rural education since 2016. KODA engages in educational activities for teachers and parents, conducting research and advocacy, and developing locally appropriate educational content, ensuring all children can discover and realize their potential through quality education.

October


Evaluating Our Global Educational Influence




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
How many EdHeroes Network events — in-person or digital — did you attend this year?




Percentage of people who believe EdHeroes is making a difference the world



Percentage of people who were directly inspired by EdHeroes to take action in making the world a better place




Percentage of people who were motivated to join and advance education-related work by participating in EdHeroes events


EdHeroes Global Forum: Cultural Heritage in Education

July 11–12, 2024 Online



In July 2024, EdHeroes hosted its inaugural Global Forum. a comprehensive 27-hour livestream attracting over 120,000 unique viewers. This event marked a pivotal milestone in exploring the intersection of cultural heritage and modern education. Featuring speakers from 40 countries and conducted in nine languages, the forum included contributions from esteemed organizations such as the World Bank. UNESCO, and UNICEF.

The Global Forum reflected EdHeroes' dedication to fostering



an inclusive and diverse educational landscape, highlighting the role of cultural heritage in shaping education worldwide. Alina Baimen, Co-founder and CEO of EdHeroes, observed the forum's growth: "We began with a modest discussion, and now it's turned into a 27-hour non-stop streaming forum, supported by fantastic organizations worldwide."

Together with Indonesian Pediatric
Cancer Foundation and Lions Club Solo
Mustika (LCSM), EdHeroes co-hosted
a humanitarian mission in three cities
in Indonesia namely: Surakarta,
Jakarta, and Yogyakarta. This initiative
sought to enrich children's lives through
creative experiences and fundraising
for their treatment.

A notable result of this mission was the creation of a 50-meter Batik cloth in collaboration with Indonesian craftsmen in conjunction with children fighting cancer, symbolizing cultural heritage and unity. 60 children in total were engaged in storytelling and fun games activities as well as painting the Batik with the craftsmen.

The event was graced by His Majesty Mangkoenagoro X's presence in Surakarta. His Majesty warmly graced the brave children participating in the batik-making process alongside the maestros, expressing messages of kindness, empathy, and admiration for the remarkable strength and perseverance of the little Heroes.
